

## INTEGRITY FIRST GRADE

### Objective:

- To use literature in teaching students the importance of integrity as a character trait.
- To help students understand that having integrity means many things.
- A person with integrity is honest, trustworthy, responsible, courageous and respectful.

**Materials:** *The Empty Pot* by Demi  
**Integrity poster**

### Activity:

**1) Introduce yourself to the class and explain that you are the Panther Pride Reader for Integrity.**

**2) Ask: What is integrity?** Children brainstorm definitions. Share poster and discuss.

Having the inner strength to be truthful, trustworthy, and honest in all things. Acting justly and honorably

Honesty, telling the truth, admitting when we are wrong  
Doing the right thing  
Keeping your word  
Treating others as you want to be treated

**3) Is it always easy to act with integrity?** Discuss.

**4) Introduce book: *The Empty Pot***

Ask children what they think this book will be about. Ask them to look at the cover and make a prediction about what will happen in the story.

**5) Read book aloud.**

**6) Ask the class:**

**Which character showed integrity?**

Ping because he did not change his seeds and had an empty pot, all the other children were not honest because they were able to grow seeds

**Was it the easy thing to do?**

no, Ping felt ashamed that his pot was empty and everyone else had a flower

## **Evaluation:**

### **7) Brainstorm ways to show integrity at home and at school.**

Return an item that you find on the ground

Tell the truth to teachers, parents and friends

Admit when you do something wrong

Return a borrowed item or keep promises by doing what you say you will
